Fund Objectives

Korea Equity Fund, Inc. ("KEF" or the "Fund") is a non-diversified, closed-end management investment company listed on the New York Stock Exchange. The Fund's investment objective is to seek long-term capital appreciation through investments primarily in equity securities of Korean companies. Under normal circumstances, the Fund will invest at least 80% of its total assets in such

securities. Nomura Asset Management U.S.A. Inc. has served as the Fund's Manager since the Fund's inception in 1993. Nomura Asset Management Co., Ltd. has served as the Fund's Investment Adviser since the Fund's inception. The Manager and Investment Adviser are subsidiaries of Nomura Holdings, Inc. and affiliates of Nomura Securities Co., Ltd., Tokyo, Japan.

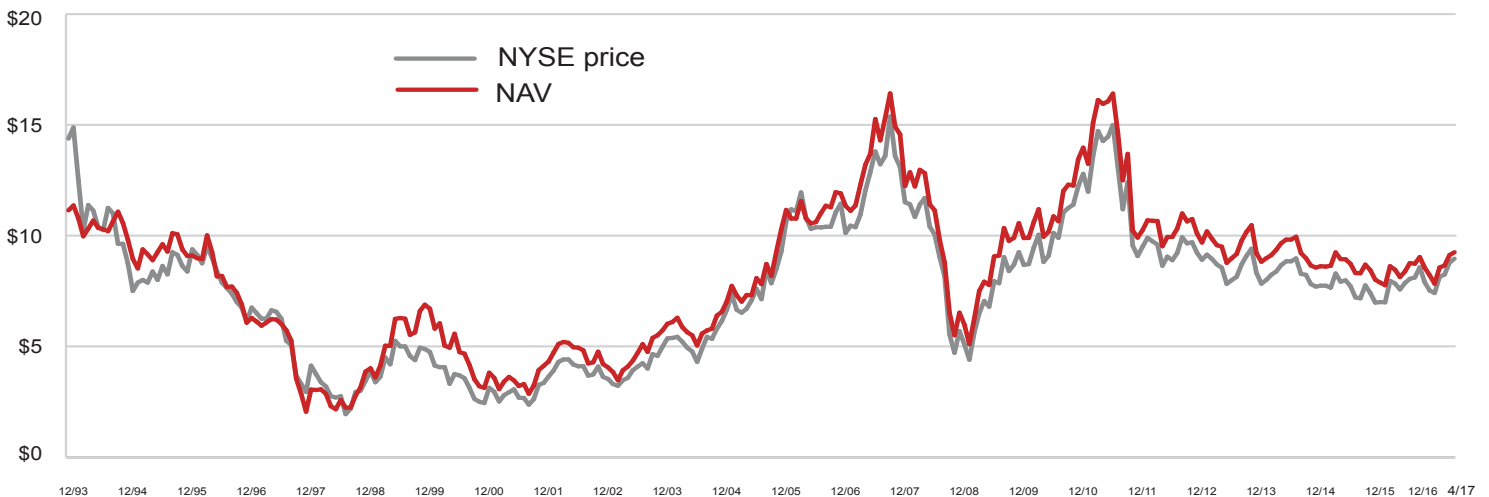

Net Asset Value Since Inception¹ vs. NYSE Closing Price (as of 4/30/2017)



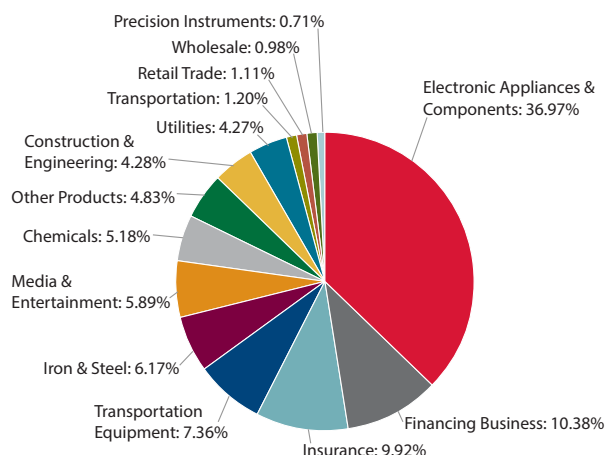

Manager's Commentary

South Korea's KOSPI Index gained 2.1% in April 2017, closing at 2,205.4. During the same period, the Korean Won depreciated by 2.0% against U.S. Dollar. Foreign investors were net sellers, disposing of USD16 million in Korean stocks during April 2017.

The Electric & Electronic Equipment sector outperformed amid expectations of better conditions for the memory market as well as improving corporate governance. The Textile & Apparel sector also performed well due to cheap valuations and expectations of a demand recovery. On the other hand, the Transport Equipment sector underperformed, mainly to concerns about weak earnings growth. Communication stocks lagged behind the market due to uncertainty over

economic policies following the Presidential election.

Korea's exports increased significantly, rising 24.2% (YOY) in April, compared with consensus expectations of 17.0% (YOY). Exports to the U.S. increased by 3.9% while exports to the EU increased by 64.9%. Exports to China and the ASEAN region grew by 10.2% and 19.8% (YOY) respectively. The Bank of Korea (BOK) maintained the policy rate at 1.25%.

We may maintain the current position in the Technology sector given stable cash flow generation. Within the sector, we may take profits on the memory manufacturers if we see further share price gains, while

we are positive toward selective electronic component names as they could be beneficiaries of a new smartphone cycle. We are bearish toward automobile-related stocks due to concerns about weaker shipment growth of auto OEMs. We are positive on selective bank/insurance names as we believe they could be beneficiaries of easing regulatory concerns. We may maintain the position in the Utility sector considering ROE improvements and attractive valuations.
